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2018 JOBS IN REVIEW

MACHIAS SOUTH SIDE SEWER INTERCEPTOR PROJECT





This spring, R.F. Jordan crews headed "Down East" and began a major sewer rehabilitation project for the town of Machias. The South Side Interceptor project involved replacing over 2000' of old asbestos clay sewer main, 2000' of individual sewer services from Grove Street all the way up to Stackpole Road (involving some night work to run a new service across Route 1 from O'Brien Avenue to a business on Grove Street), replacing and/or rehabilitating all of the basins in that area, relining over 4300' of the main, and some improvements at the wastewater treatment plant.









BLUE HILL CO-OP MARKET

This summer, R.F. Jordan crews began site work for the new Blue Hill Co-Op Market building on South Street in Blue Hill. The project involved clearing the land, bringing in over 20,000 yards of fill to level the site, paving the driveway and parking areas, installing a Storm-Tec drainage system, excavating and backfilling the foundation, and bringing the utilities into the new building. As the general contractor E.L. Shea works on the building, we will put the finishing touches to the outside with an anticipated opening in the fall of 2019.





MAINE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION ROUTE 46 CULVERT REPLACEMENT









As part of their continuing mission to maintain and upgrade Maine's transportation infrastructure, the Department of Transportation contracted with R.F. Jordan to install a new box culvert on Route 46 in Eddington. The new culvert is 6' tall, 16' wide, and spans the entire width of Route 46, carrying a stream safely underneath the roadway. Plans are in the works to install a similar culvert on Route 46 in Bucksport in 2019.

BANGOR/BREWER RIVERWALK

Two separate walkway projects on either side of the Penobscot River kept R.F. Jordan crews busy in 2018. On the Bangor side, we installed a new retaining wall, installed new lighting along the path, and graded and paved the walkway. Over in Brewer, we also installed 4 new retaining walls and cut a new pedestrian tunnel through an abutment on the Joshua Chamberlain Bridge. New landscaping along the path, some new fencing, along with some improvements to Center Street in Brewer rounded out the project.





DAIRY QUEEN



This fall, R.F. Jordan put the finishing touches on the new Dairy Queen building on High Street in Ellsworth, working with the general contractor Nichols Construction to fill, grade, and pave the parking lots, build and grade sidewalks and a patio, install lighting and drive-thru menu sign posts, and site drainage. The restaurant has an anticipated opening in December 2018, and we will return in the spring of 2019 to put the finishing touches to the site.

UNIVERSITY OF MAINE

This year, R.F. Jordan contracted with the University of Maine to provide on-call excavation and pipe work services to the Orono campus. Projects so far have included sewer line repairs at the Steam Plant and Gannett Hall, installing new storm water drainage in front of Stevens Hall, and a water line repair at Witter Farm.





HANCOCK COUNTY JAIL





This spring, R.F. Jordan was awarded the contract for the improvements for the Day Yard at the Hancock County Jail. Our work included installing a new retaining wall, relocating the HVAC chiller, installing a new security fence, and grading and paving the yard area.



PLOWING

In addition to our groundwork, the winter of 2017-2018 kept us busy with snow removal! We plowed the towns of Waltham and Dedham along with our many, many residential and commercial contracts all over the area.





RESIDENTIAL





2018 was another busy year for our work on residential projects in the area, doing everything from lot clearing to road building to excavating and backfilling foundations and much, much more!



NEW EQUIPMENT

As part of our efforts to continually upgrade our equipment to help us do our jobs faster and more efficiently, 2018 saw R.F. Jordan purchase a new Level Best skidsteer grader attachment, complete with all the equipment needed to connect the attachment with our Topcon GPS system. The grader works similarly to all our other GPS-enabled equipment - it takes the signals from the satellite and the base station set up on site and will automatically adjust the grader to within a fraction of an inch of the desired grade. After some initial adjustments, it has proven its worth on the Dairy Queen and the Blue Hill Co-Op projects, and we look forward to putting it to work in 2019!



UPCOMING PROJECTS

2019 will be another busy year for R.F. Jordan! We are bidding on many jobs, continuing several jobs from 2018, and have some exciting new work beginning in 2019, including a major rehabilitation of Main Street in Northeast Harbor which is projected to last 2 years and involve replacing water, sewer, and stormwater drain lines, rebuilding sidewalks, and excavating, grading, and repaving the roadway. We have also recently started a project at the Bar Harbor Inn to replace the old swimming pool and do the groundwork for a new amenities building and patio to accompany the new pool. Also in the works is a new retaining wall for Ross Manor in Bangor. Here's looking forward to a busy 2019!
